We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Covert Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-2022. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified was not given one of those labels.

In order to meet the needs of our students, we are addressing the learning deficiencies of middle school students that have been identified based on their NWEA scores. This year the middle school created a 20-minute class called Successful Learning. TRAILS will be taught by our School Counselor once a week to MS students. Students have also taken responsibility for grades and missing assignments. PLC time has been dedicated to reviewing and revising processes and procedures currently in place. Monthly data review meetings allow staff to collaborate, monitor student progress and adjust instructional strategies.

Student Assignment to Schools

Covert Public Schools assigns students to schools based on their current grade level. Covert Elementary serves students in grades Pre-Kindergarten to fifth grade. Students in grades sixth through eighth are enrolled at Covert Middle School. Covert High School serves students in grades ninth- twelfth. Students in eleventh grade have the opportunity to enroll at the Technology Center at the Van Buren Intermediate School District.

School Improvement Status

The staff at Covert Middle School collaborates to create an improvement plan to focus on the needs of ALL students. Goals are created in different subject areas with a focus on reading achievement. The plan is monitored throughout the year to monitor the progress on each goal. The goals are analyzed to ensure that our strategies and activities are benefiting students based on the data. Adjustments are made to the goals when necessary to raise student achievement.

Specialized Schools

The Van Buren Intermediate School District collaborates with Covert Middle School to provide services for students with special needs.

Core Curriculum

Covert Middle School has developed a core curriculum as mandated by the State of Michigan. Teachers have received training in common core instruction and have created safety net standards for reading and math.
